






The Global Proliferation of "Lily-Pad" Bases

Map depicts small lily-pad bases ("cooperative security locations") built since around 2000. Given lily pads' secrecy, many more may exist. At closed bases, U.S. forces may retain access rights. For ease of comparison we use contemporary borders and a Mercator projection.


Overseas Bases...

- 1. Cost taxpayers ~\$51.5 billion annually
- 2. Launch offensive, interventionist wars
- 3. Are now largely obsolete thanks to technological advancements
- 4. Increase military tension
- 5. Support at least 40 dictatorial, repressive, undemocratic regimes
- 6. Cause "blowback"
- 7. Damage the environment
- 8. Damage the U.S. international reputation + generate protest
- 9. Are bad for families










