





THE DISPLACED, 1898-2015








THE GLOBAL PROLIFERATION OF LILY PAD BASES




THE U.S. MILITARY'S GROWING INTEREST IN AFRICA






Alternatives and Conversion Opportunities

Alternatives

- Regular review process by Pentagon/Congress for every base
- Incentives for military to close unnecessary bases
- Environmental clean-up contracts for companies losing base contracts
- Continued cuts/restriction of overseas military construction \$
- Moratorium on new base construction

Alternatives

- Extend Leahy Law: No bases in undemocratic nations
- Tax code changes so base contracts abroad do not offer tax advantages vs. domestic contracts
- End secret SOFAs/base agreements: Effectively treaties, should be subject to Congressional approval, public inspection
- International ban on foreign bases? Prevent "base races" (strict exceptions for credible threats, prepo, peacekeeping, monitoring)
